

| CITY OF BILLINGS BRIEF IN SUPPORT OF MOTION FOR A |

PROTECTIVE ORDER

THE CITY OF BILLINGS has moved the Court for an Order pursuant to M.R.Civ.P. 26(c) staying further discovery in the above action. That Rule is set forth, in pertinent part, as follows:

(1) In General. A party or any person from whom discovery is sought may move for a protective order in the court where the action is pending--or as an alternative on matters relating to a deposition, in the court for the district where the deposition will be taken. The motion must include a certification that the movant has in good faith conferred or attempted to confer with other affected parties in an effort to resolve the dispute without court action. The court may, for good cause, issue an order to protect a party or person from annoyance, embarrassment, oppression, or undue burden or expense....'

This case is not about what needs to be done, but who is to do what and how to go about getting it done. The City is not concealing any of the information requested. Indeed, it has provided all relevant documents to the Court for its in camera inspection as required by numerous cases decided by

the Supreme Court of Montana. The City is without authority to adjudicate the proper balance between the Public's Right to Know and the Individual Right to Privacy. The Court has expressed its opinion that the information on any line on any page in any document in the materials submitted to it will 'spill the beans' and compromise the privacy rights of all individuals mentioned in these documents.

The Gazette has chosen, nonetheless, to proceed with discovery requests that would result in the disclosure of all the information in the case, whether it pertains to a subject of the investigation, a witness, or an investigator. The individuals mentioned in the report would be deprived of their Right to Privacy without due process of law if this were permitted to occur.

The discovery responses would moot all rights of all parties mentioned in the documents, and to the extent any disclosure is later determined to be unlawful or improper, it would subject the citizens of Billings to numerous claims that could be brought to make the determination as to the proper balance between the Public Right to Know and the Individual Right of Privacy under the facts of this case. That determination has to be made by the highest court in this state if this double jeopardy situation is to be avoided.

Such a determination in advance of any release of documents would also protect the Gazette from any subsequent claims brought by individuals. The Court has had these documents for some time now in a form that permits it to make its determination, and the Court is the one institution involved in this case that is so constituted and so trained to make an impartial and unbiased ruling as to the proper balance to be struck in this case between these two vital constitutional rights held by every individual and entity in the State of Montana.

In order to the case to proceed as the Supreme Court of Montana has always held such matters should proceed, before the City responds to any discovery requests propounded by the Gazette, further discovery should be

stayed and the Court should rule on the merits forthwith, in a manner that does not moot the appeal rights of any person mentioned in the report. DATED this 19th day of December, 2014.
